How To Prepare For A Natural Disaster

Across the world, millions of people are experiencing natural disasters including our home state of California. This leaves many unaware of what to do and how to approach a life threatening situation. California is known for wildfires, landslides, earthquakes, and flooding. In order to survive these events, it is necessary to be aware of what to do when these disasters occur.

If a wildfire occurs, always stay calm. If on foot, head to a safe area of vegetation that is far from the flaming area and call 911. If you're at home or another sheltered place, immediately evacuate the area. Close all doors and windows, take down any flammable curtains, and

turn off all systems in the house.

Landslides in California occur because of the disturbance in the natural stability of a slope. Evacuate the area immediately and especially if you hear unusual sounds such as moving debris and cracking trees. Always stay alert and listen to the radio for any local announcements on the landslide.

California is overdue for a major earthquake that could strike at any second. The first thing to do if an earthquake occurs while you're inside is drop to the ground and crouch down, take cover under a sturdy table or furniture, and cover your face and head with your arms until it is safe to get up. Stay away from

glass, doors, and furniture that could fall on you. If you're ever outdoors during an earthquake, stay there and move away from buildings, streetlights, and other hazardous materials until the shaking has stopped.

Flooding is very common in California and it can be unpredictable and dangerous at any point. When there's a flash flood warning, always avoid walking and driving in the floodwaters and go shelter. Always make sure you have an emergency kit and to listen for weather and emergency updates. To be prepared in your home, unplug all electrical appliances, turn off your gas and electricity so it helps prevent a fire, and if possible go upstairs.

In any situation like this, you should always have an emergency kit just in case. This kit can include water, non-perishable food, battery powered radio, flashlight, extra batteries, and a first aid kit. Store this kit in your car and home because disaster can strike at any second and anywhere!

Natural Disasters in California

California is notorious for natural disasters such as landslides, heatwaves, earthquakes, and floods. These forces of nature raise many questions. By knowing the history of natural disasters in our own state of California, we can learn how to prepare for the future. Natural disasters have occurred and have been recorded in California since the year 1862, when Sacramento was submerged under twenty feet of water due to flooding. As it turns out, Los Angeles is one of the top ten cities in the world for

the number of "people potentially affected" by a natural disaster. The most common type of natural disaster associated with is the California earthquake. The National Earthquake Information Center reports that 12,000-14,000 earthquakes erupt each year around the world, or 35 a day. Each year, California generally gets two or three earthquakes large enough to cause moderate damage to structures. Along with earthquakes, California is also known for having disastrous wildfires. Some of the

most damaging wildfires were the Cedar Fire in San Diego in the year 2003. It burned 273,246 acres and while it didn't destroy any structures, the fire killed fifteen people. The most recent fire, the Thomas Fire, happened in December of 2017. It burned through Ventura and Santa Barbara, scorching 281,620 acres, about 440 miles. This fire destroyed 1,063 structures. The final most common natural disaster is heatwaves. This strike of Mother Nature isn't very common but it's just as deadly as

earthquakes and fires. The deadliest heatwave occurrence to date happened in July of 2006. The Central Valley and Los Angeles regions suffered a blistering two week long heatwave. The city of Fresno had temperatures above 110 degrees that lasted for fourteen days straight. More than 140 people, many of them elderly, died to the extreme temperatures. Natural disasters are unavoidable but because of these past disasters we are able to learn how to prepare for the next "big one."

Elon Musk's Goals For SpaceX

Elon Musk is the founder and CEO of major space travel company SpaceX and car dealership Tesla INC. Elon Musk has big plans and aspirations for his company, SpaceX. One of Elon Musk's greatest achievements is his rocket the Falcon 9. The Falcon 9 rocket is one of the most safe and reliable rockets to ever transport satellites into space. It also sent a free flying spacecraft (Dragon) into space in 2012. The Falcon 9 is the first orbital class rocket that can be sent back into space and be reused. A reusable rocket reduces the cost and materials used to make rockets and it significantly lowers the cost to

access space. The reusability of a rocket also makes it easier to have interplanetary colonization. The Dragon spacecraft is also a major accomplishment for Elon Musk and SpaceX because it became the first commercial spacecraft in history to deliver cargo to the International Space Station (ISS) and safely return cargo to earth.

The Dragon Spacecraft is the only spacecraft that is still able to keep on being sent out into orbit and bringing and taking large amounts of cargo. It was initially designed to take humans to space but, Elon decided against it so he used it to transport important

cargo instead. Elon's SpaceX and NASA are teaming up to send refine the original plans so they could send up a manned crew in it instead of cargo. SpaceX and NASA are planning on sending the first crew up in 2018 with the Falcon Heavy rocket.

Finally Elon Musk's greatest goal for 2018 is the launch of the most high tech rocket ever. The Falcon Heavy. The Falcon Heavy is set to lift off on February 6, 2018. It is set and ready to take his payload, the Tesla Roadster, into space. The Falcon Heavy is so strong it will be able to lift 54 metric tons (119,000 pounds) into orbit. The Falcon Heavy's is more

than twice as powerful as its closest competitor the Delta IV Heavy and it costs less than 1/3 of the Delta IV Heavy. The Falcon Heavy builds off of the Falcon 9's success and reliability. It is composed of three Falcon 9 nine engine rocket cores. The Rocket is so powerful it has the possibility to send a crew to the Moon or to Mars. It is planned to be the most successful rocket ever sent into orbit. Elon Musk is planning on making an impact in Space Exploration and he is heading in the right direction. He is set to break many records and overtake NASA as the most successful space agency.

90th Oscars Nominations

On March 4, the 90th annual Academy Awards hosted by Jimmy Kimmel (for the second year in a row) will award the coveted Oscar statues to winners determined by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Science honoring the best in film from 2017. The main contenders are Guillermo del Toro's *The Shape of Water*, which leads with 13 nominations, including Best Picture, Best Actress, Best Supporting Actress, Best Supporting Actor, Best Director, Best Original Screenplay, in addition to more technical awards. *Dunkirk* closely follows with eight nominations in mostly technical fields, but still garnered a Best Picture and Best Director (Christopher Nolan) nod. The surprise hit *Get Out* was also nominated for Best Picture, Best Director, and Best Original Screenplay Oscars, among others.

The nominations for Best Picture are:

Call Me By Your Name: An independent film about a homosexual romance between a

17-year old teen and a 24-year old adult. It has lost steam in early awards shows and has no real chance of winning.

Darkest Hour: The obligatory biopic nominee of Winston Churchill's (Gary Oldman) rise to the role of Prime Minister of Great Britain during World War II which ties in neatly to the next nominee.

Dunkirk: Christopher Nolan (director of *Inception*, *Interstellar*, and the *Dark Knight* trilogy) immerses the viewer into the evacuation of Allied troops trapped at the Dunkirk beachfront in France under an increasingly advancing Nazi force. This is Nolan's greatest chance in his career's history of a Best Picture win, and considering his other films will likely stand the test of time, he may actually have a shot. This could be considered tied with *Three Billboards* for the 3rd likeliest Best Picture award.

Get Out: A darkly comedic and horror-genre hybrid with commentary on race relations as an interracial couple goes on a

weekend getaway with parents in a twist on the classic *Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?* Judging on its political commentary, the Academy will likely prop this film in the 2nd most likely contender for Best Picture.

Lady Bird: A comedy about a teenage girl's experience in Catholic high school. This film has the least possible chance of winning, but looks affable enough.

Phantom Thread: Daniel Day Lewis' (supposed) final acting role forms the backbone of a drama concerning a dressmaker and his conflicts with his romantic interest. Another film with very little chance of winning.

The Post: Steven Spielberg, Tom Hanks, and Meryl Streep (in the process earning her 21st Oscar nomination) team up to tell the story of the Washington Post's discovery of Pentagon Papers, where the U.S. government kept secret from the public information about the Vietnam War. Likely nominated to show solidarity with the press,

this film also has little chance of winning considering *Spotlight*, another newsroom drama, won Best Picture in 2016.

The Shape of Water: A mute janitor meets a humanoid creature in a secret government facility and falls in love. This fantasy romance has the best chance of winning Best Picture for its surreal and intriguing appeal.

Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri: A mother takes matters into her own hands to solve her daughter's murder. While this did when Best Drama at the Golden Globes, *Billboards* has been losing steam in public appeal as time goes on, and likely will not win Best Picture, but is tied with *Dunkirk* in the top 3 contenders list.

Short films and animated films (including *The Boss Baby!*), in addition to documentaries and technical achievements will be honored at the ceremony which is March 4, airing only on ABC at 5 PM Pacific Time.

Senior boys those who are turning 18 it is the time to register to vote and to register for the draft. When registering to vote there is a option allowing men to enter the draft that way. The military draft is used if the government feels that the military does not have enough forces in a large scale war so civilian men are called to join as seen fit. As of right now there troops who want to serve on their own and this is known as all volunteer military. The United States offers benefits to attract troops

to enlist during a peacetime. Though the draft is not actively in effect now men between 18 to 25 must register with the Selective Service Stem for them to make a potential draftee list. Women cannot be drafted right now under current laws. Men should register within 30 days of turning 18 or entering the country. Those who do not register can be prosecuted and be fined for \$250,000 or up to 5 years of jail time. They are also eliminated from some federal benefits.

Lent

What is Lent? The holy season of Lent is a Roman Catholic tradition that takes place in the spring time of the year. Catholics spend forty days reflecting on to belief of prayer by either giving up something they true care about or adding something to their life that will better them for a closer relationship with Christ.

“Lent is the spring time of the church” Father G. said when asked what Lent was. He believes the word “Lent” comes from the word

“lengthening”. In Latin the word Lent is “quadragesima”. The Quadragesima Sunday is the Sunday following Ash Wednesday which is the first Sunday during the holy season of Lent. When we asked Father G. when Lent is normally celebrated he said, “Easter determines the start of Lent.” By which he means the last day of Lent is Easter so you would go forty days before then without counting the Sundays. The actual end date of Lent is Holy Thursday which is

the last Thursday before Easter. Also, the last Friday of Lent is called Good Friday. Good Friday and Ash Wednesday are the two mandatory days that Catholics fast meaning that they do not eat full meals all day. They only eat one meal and two smaller meals with no snacking in between. On Fridays, they do not eat any type of meat but they are allowed any salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibian, reptiles, and shellfish as are animal-derived products such as gelatin, butter,

cheese, and eggs. As long as it doesn’t have any meat taste.

The start of the Easter Vigil is on Saturday evening (dusk) which is the Ceremony of Lights. The Ceremony of Lights is when everyone walks into the Church with an unlit candle while there is a small fire somewhere in the mass and the Paschal Candle is lit from that fire (a large sacramental candle). Everyone’s candle is lit from this one by passing on the flame to one another.

The point of giving something up or changing something in your life positively for the forty-days is to break into the habit of doing better. When Father G. was asked what he was giving up or doing differently he said, “Sin”. During this season of Lent the there will be events of Lent being celebrated such as the Rice Bowl, the Adoration of the Blessed Sacraments, the Thirty-Hour Fast, Veritas Retreat, and the Lenten Penance Service.
