6th Annual Grandparent Day





Andy began his career

at Paraclete in 1982. He came along with his friend and new principal of Paraclete, Mr. Cleo Martinez. Andy would become a teacher...coach...A.S.B. Moderator...Key Club Moderator...etc. He came with his Hopes and Dreams, Beliefs, and Love of Teaching, Coaching, and Moderating.

A short list of some of his beliefs are:

God the Father, Jesus the Savior, the Paraclete...Spirit of Inspiration. The Catholic Faith, Mary's intercession for us, the power of the Rosary (this was a big one). The Dodgers and Tommy Lasorda, Ronald Reagan's Presidency, the Constitution of the United States. Voting on Election Day, Practicing Hard, and Playing with Heart. He also believed he was...as the movie Frozen calls out...a bit of "A Fixer-Upper." One of Andy's favorite things was giving a talk..."The Gav Talk" as we called it on the Senior Retreat. It became a regular part of any Senior Retreat. He spoke about his family, his close friends, his Hope for Heaven...He almost always began and finished with his repetition of the word HUMMINA. The meaning of this word he said...would be revealed in the talk itself. (And I will reveal it at the end of this talk). Andy hoped for: the Promise of Heaven, to

see his Mom, his Dad, and his old best friend again. He never lost Hope that he would one day meet that one special gal ...for his life companion. He hoped for just one more shot ...at a C.I.F. Basketball Title. He hoped to teach and inspire others. He hoped to spend many weekends at his sister's beautiful condo in Ventura. He hoped for PEACE on Earth...and to keep going...despite his physical health. One of his last hopes was to take a Baseball Tour Group around

the big and little cities of the U.S. Andy found hope and inspiration r movies...like Hoosiers with G e n e Hackman. And the song "Spirit in the Sky" by Norman Greenbaum. Probably the **BIGGEST** part his o f personality was his tremendous love of Life and People. If Andy

really "loved and respected you" you would on occasion receive an "Andy Visit." This would last for many minutes ... consisting of stories, anecdotes, small complaints, and sharings.

A small list of his loves would be:

Again ...God, Jesus, Mary, the Holy Spirit ...the Rosary. His Mom, Dad, Sisters, old Coaching friends and stories, lots of stories ...the '88 Dodgers (Tommy). Teaching any and all history courses. All good and devoted teachers (like his Mom). The Spirit of the Paraclete Students, and the Paraclete Sports Teams, especially basketball, and college basketball and the Sweet Sixteen. Coach Wooden of U.C.L.A. fame ...the movie Hoosiers again ...and saying the word "Hummina." Andy was a CHRISTMAS guy ...toy drives ...giving and receiving presents ...and carols. He loved his special Carol Project, where students would write history lessons inside Christmas songs. He especially loved a classroom with that "lived in look and feeling."

Andy loved to get all dressed up in a tuxedo and go to the student prom and DANCE. He had that slow Twist Style ...kind of like the gopher in the movie Caddy Shack. Although he was a man of belief (FAITH) and dreams (HOPE), and love, Andy was not a walking saint. He'd be the first to tell you that. He and I used to joke that our ultimate hope was to just make it to Purgatory (Because of course Heaven was next ...don't you know your Catholic Faith?). Andy was a man of Faith, Hope, and Charity who believed the parable of Jesus about the two men who went to the Temple to pray ... one a Pharisee and the other a humble repentant Tax Collector. Who went home "justified" (forgiven)? Yes, the Tax Collector. Oh, I almost forgot ...the meaning of Hummina, Hummina, Hummina...of course Andy was telling us that this means FAITH, HOPE, and LOVE. So I have flowers for his sisters...Blue for Faith ... White for Hope ... Red for Love ... and for his brother-inlaw ...a cross from his desk with the prayer "Footsteps."

Alumni Profile ~ Dan Yaroslaski

A Life Discovering Purpose, Passion and Mission

Dan Yaroslaski and his wife Sarah (Warren) both graduated from Paraclete High School in 1988. Dan did not waste any time making a difference with the

United States Marine Corps, with Sarah at his side. Known as Colonel Dan Yaroslaski, he is most recently the Commanding Officer for the Assault Amphibian School in Camp Pendleton.

After high school graduation, Dan enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserve and served as an Anti-Armor Missileman, Dragon Platoon, Weapons Company, 2nd Battalion, 23d Marines, at Port Hueneme, California. He graduated from Loyola Marymount



University, Los Angeles, with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science with a Minor in Philosophy, and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in 1992. In the same year, he married Sarah, his high school sweetheart.

Dan has commanded at every rank; his commands include: Platoon Commander, 3d Platoon, Company C, 3d Assault Amphibian Battalion (AABn), 1st MARDIV; Commanding Officer, Headquarters and Service Company, Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS); Commanding Officer, Company B, 3d AABn, 1st MARDIV; Inspector-Instructor, I-I Gulfport MS, 4th AABn, 4th MARDIV; Commanding Officer, Combat Assault Battalion (CAB), 3d MARDIV; Commanding Officer, Assault Amphibian School, Marine Corps Training Command.

His significant staff assignments are many and one would need a military jargon dictionary for translations. His operational deployments include three Unit Deployment Program rotations to Okinawa Japan; Operation COOPERATION FROM THE SEA, Vladivostok, Russia; Operation IRAQI FREEDOM as a Tactical Movement Control Officer; and Operation ENDURING FREEDOM as an Embedded Transition Team with

the Afghan 1st Kandak, 2nd Brigade, 201st Corps.

Dan's education after Loyola Marymount University include the following: U.S. Army Armor Officer Advance Course, the Marine Corps Command and Staff College, the School of Advanced Warfighting and the Marine Corps War College. His academic achievements include a Masters of Military Studies, a Masters of Operational Studies and a Masters of Strategic Studies from the Marine Corps University. His publications include a co-authored chapter titled "Spirituality and Leadership in the Marine Corps" for the book Leading with Values published by Cambridge University Press, a co-authored chapter titled "Enacting a Culture of Ethical Leadership: Command and Control as Unifying Mind," for the book Aspects of Leadership: Ethics, Law and Spirituality and a chapter titled "The Advisor" for the book Marines at War both published by the Marine Corps University Press. He has been an adjunct faculty member in the Marine Corps College of Distance Education and Training for the Expeditionary Warfare School and Command and Staff since 2006.

His personal decorations include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal with two Gold Stars, Joint Service Achievement Medal with Two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal and the Combat Action Ribbon with Gold Star.

With Dan's success throughout his military career, he shares, "Clearly the strong academic foundation I built at Paraclete helped me in my studies, and in my writing. I believe that the solid foundation in ethics I received from

teachers like Carl Ladensack, Andy Gavel, Mike

McGuire, and Sandra Acciani helped shape me into the leader I am today." Dan appreciates his Catholic education for the faith, values, and spirituality that were instilled within him.

Quizzed about the locales he has visited Dan replied, "As for countries visited, some are nicer than others, but I have learned a lot from visiting each of them: 22 total, 4 of 7 continents... and counting - I only add a country to my list if I visited for MORE than an airport layover AND had a meaningful cultural exchange – that is - walked the streets, talked to the people, tried the food and drink: Canada, Mexico, Japan, Korea, Russia, Australia, Philippines, Indonesia, Taiwan, Vietnam, Cambodia, Thailand, India, Kuwait, Iraq, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Turkey, Italy, France, Germany, and Kyrgyzstan."

Dan added some professional news: "I am heading back to the Pentagon in March. I will be the Chief of Staff to the Deputy Commandant for Information (the Deputy Commandant is a Lieutenant General, 3 Star, responsible for Marine Corps investments and strategy in Cyber Operations, Information Operations, Electronic Warfare, Civil Affairs, Space, Intelligence, and other information related capabilities)."

Dan enjoys sailing when he has the opportunity. He is grateful for the family love and dedication Sarah and their children have shown. He describes a driven family: "Our son Sam is a Junior at Great Lakes

Maritime Academy studying for a BS in Maritime Systems to be a Maritime Systems Engineer on merchant ships, and our daughter Anna is a completing her Associates Degree in Math and Computer Science at Howard Community College, and will be transferring to a four year university in the fall to complete her Computer Science Degree. My wife Sarah has decided that after lots of volunteering and dedicated support to our children and our family, she is going to pursue nursing with an RN degree with designs on a career in public health planning and management." Sarah's life has been led with a very giving and nurturing spirit. Dan continued, "She has been a Government Civilian in charge of Research Grants and Research Management at the Department of Defense Medical School, the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences, she has run her own photography business, taught piano lessons for years, served as President of the Okinawan Women's Welfare Association (a joint US/Japanese women's benevolent group on Okinawa), president of multiple spouse clubs, started or managed multiple non-profit Horse Rescues, managed horse barns, and of course taught both of our children when they were home schooled. She has been interested in public health and healthcare since college, but given the nature of military service she made our children's stability a priority. Now with both kids moving on with their own lives, she has the time to re-engage her desire to do even more for the community."
