Mask Up & Keep Your Distance

- It is recommended where applicable that all students, faculty and staff must keep three feet of physical distance between each other in classrooms, offices, other school buildings and outdoors.

Dress Code

All students will follow the dress code found in the Parent/Student Handbook. As a reminder here is the daily dress code, please consult the Parent/Student

handbook or the Deans for specific requirements:

- Students must wear a red, white, black or gray uniform polo with the PHS logo which can be purchased in the Haydee's Place (Spirit store).
- Students must wear cotton, denim or corduroy pants in black, white or khaki. Blue Jeans may NOT be worn. Pants must be worn fitted to the waist with no holes or tears.
- Walking shorts in Khaki, black or white are also permitted.
- Girls may also wear capris in khaki, black, or white.
- Shoes are required and can be either dress or athletic shoes - NO slides or sandals without backs are allowed.
- Hair for all students must be kept clean, neat and presentable. No Beards or colors not found in natural hair colors.
- No earrings for boys or nose rings for both boys and girls - These will occasionally be permitted during specific events but only when specified in the event dress code.

Infectious Control Measures per LA County Department of Public Health

- The Paraclete High School Covid Compliance Team consists of the leadership team at the school. If you have any specific questions about Covid compliance or if you need to report that your child has Covid 19 or has been exposed to Covid 19 please contact Dana Johnston, Ministry of Operational Vitality at 661-943-3255 or djohnston@avphs.net or Annette Olague, Dean of Students, at 661-943-3255 or aolague@avphs.net, or Art Lopez, Dean of Students, at 661-943-3255 ext 109 or alopez@avphs.net.
- If a student tests positive for Covid 19, please inform the school immediately by contacting Dana Johnston. They will begin the contact tracing to ensure any members of the school community that need to be informed of exposure are notified. They will also report the case to the LACDPH per reporting requirements. Students' confidentiality will be maintained during this entire process. Students who test positive must isolate at home until fever free for 24 hours, improved symptoms, **AND** 10 days from symptom onset.
- If a student becomes ill at school the following procedures are in place:
 - Once a student begins to display symptoms or informs a staff or faculty member that they do not feel well, they will be escorted to the wellness center, where parents/guardians will be notified to either release the student (if they drive) or to pick them up.
 - Students will be picked up in the back parking lot
 - The student will also receive a factsheet or other informational materials that are to be given to them covering regulations governing self-isolation and links to sites with further information.

- If a student is exposed to a covid positive person:
- According to the California Department of Health, If you are not vaccinated:
 - “When both parties were wearing a mask in any school setting in which students are supervised by school staff (including indoor or outdoor school settings and school buses, including on buses operated by public and private school systems), unvaccinated students who are close contacts (more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period within 0-6 feet indoors) may undergo a modified quarantine as follows. They may continue to attend school for in-person instruction if they:
 - i. Are asymptomatic;
 - ii. Continue to appropriately mask, as required;
 - iii. Undergo at least twice weekly testing during the 10-day quarantine; and
 - iv. Continue to quarantine for all extracurricular activities at school, including sports, and activities within the community setting.”
 - Quarantine recommendations for: unvaccinated close contacts who were not wearing masks or for whom the infected individual was not wearing a mask during the indoor exposure; or unvaccinated students as described in #8 above.
 - a. For these contacts, those who remain asymptomatic, meaning they have NOT had any symptoms, may discontinue self-quarantine under the following conditions:
 - i. Quarantine can end after Day 10 from the date of last exposure without testing; OR
 - ii. Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a diagnostic specimen is collected after Day 7 from the date of last exposure and tests negative.
 - b. To discontinue quarantine before 14 days following last known exposure, asymptomatic close contacts must:
 - i. Continue daily self-monitoring for symptoms through Day 14 from last known exposure; AND
 - ii. Follow all recommended non-pharmaceutical interventions (e.g.,

wearing a mask when around others, hand washing, avoiding crowds) through Day 14 from last known exposure.

- c. If any symptoms develop during this 14-day period, the exposed person must immediately isolate, get tested and contact their healthcare provider with any questions regarding their care.”

PROTECT MYSELF
